

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please follow the UIC application checklist to avoid delays. UIC will only accept documents that are uploaded electronically.

- UIC Online Supplemental Application & Fee:** The deadline to submit both the CAAPID and UIC online application is **June 15, 2022**. The UIC online supplemental application can be accessed via this link: <https://applygrad.uic.edu/apply/>
A non-refundable \$150 application fee is required. UIC only accepts credit card payments.

- UIC International Credential Evaluation Fee**
A non-refundable \$100 UIC International Credential Evaluation Fee is assessed for all graduate and professional degree-seeking applicants who have post-secondary coursework taken outside the United States. The fee is assessed once per application term. Payment of the fee will be requested online through the application checklist after submission of the application.

DOCUMENTS THAT SHOULD BE UPLOADED AS PART OF THE UIC SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION:

- PDF Copy of Dental Education Transcripts & Diploma:** copy of official credentials (transcript/marksheets) and diploma from post-secondary schools (related to your dental education only) issued by the University. You will be able to upload the document to the Combined Academic Credentials tab in the online application, please be sure to merge your transcript and diploma.
- PDF Copy of credentials from a post-secondary program you have attended:** If you have completed a US degree you should indicate this information on your CAAPID and UIC application. You will have to upload a transcript and degree (if available).
- PDF Copy of English Translation of Dental Education Transcripts:** copy of English translation of official credentials from post-secondary schools (related to your dental education only) that are not in English. UIC recommends that you obtain your translation from an American Translator's Association (ATA) member.
- PDF Copy of Translation of Dental Diploma:** copy of English translation of your dental degree and any other dental related certificate or diploma. UIC recommends that you obtain your translation from an American Translator's Association (ATA) member.
- Evidence of English competency** - It is required that TOEFL scores be reported electronically directly to UIC by ETS. The University of Illinois at Chicago institution code with **ETS TOEFL is 1851, graduate program**. **Students selected for an interview will be required to bring the official unopened score report to the interview day.**
