

UIC College of Dentistry and Affiliated Sites and Hospitals

The Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery program at the University of Illinois Chicago is unique in that it provides each resident a variety of experiences in each of its affiliated sites, including:

University of Illinois College of Dentistry
University of Illinois Hospital and Health Sciences System (UI Health)
Jesse Brown Veterans Administration Hospital
Advocate Christ Medical Center

The residents rotate through each of these institutions in order to broaden their exposure to the full scope of oral and maxillofacial surgery and to augment their experiences with a diverse faculty.

The University of Illinois College of Dentistry is located across the street from the University Hospital. A completely renovated and progressive postdoctoral Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Clinic offers care to patients referred from the hospital, the dental college and private dental and medical practitioners. The Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery interacts intimately with other departments within the College of Dentistry. The College of Dentistry is also the point of congregation of the residents and attending surgeons for many conferences, lectures and programs.

The University of Illinois Medical Center is a modern 600-bed tertiary care facility, which serves as the primary teaching hospital for the University of Illinois, College of Medicine. Dedicated in 1980, the University of Illinois Hospital is an eight-story facility with the most advanced medical technology available today. Patient care programs encompass the entire spectrum of health services and the medical staff is composed of recognized leaders in a variety of specialties. The University of Illinois Hospital serves as a referral site for the seriously ill throughout the United States and other countries. The medical center is part of a 365-acre tract on the West Side of Chicago, which contains the largest concentration of medical facilities in the world.

The Jesse Brown Veterans Administration Medical Center is a 538-bed tertiary care facility renowned for its progressive research projects, academic affiliations, and community collaborative ventures. The majority of the University's programs include rotations through the Veterans Administration West Side Medical Center. Approximately 1,000,000 veterans reside in the medical center's primary service area. This complex is the outpatient clinic of jurisdiction for all veterans living in Illinois and four counties of Northwestern Indiana. **Dr. Raza Hussain** is the Chief of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Advocate Christ Medical Center is a Level I trauma hospital in Southwest Chicago where OMFS residents will rotate for their Trauma Surgery experience during their General Surgery rotations (48 month residents), or their General Surgery internship (72 month program). Major maxillofacial trauma experience with, on-call responsibilities, is provided at this hospital.
